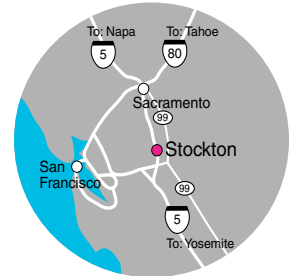


DOWNTOWN STOCKTON

Home to three minor league sports teams and the San Joaquin government, Downtown Stockton boasts historic architecture mixed with an affordable and eclectic dining.



Getting here

Stockton is conveniently located in the center of California. From Hwy 99 north or south, take Hwy 4 west, Downtown Exit, and exit El Dorado St. From I-5 north or south, take Hwy 4 east, Downtown Exit, and exit El Dorado St. To find out how to get here by boat or train, visit www.downtownstockton.org.

GO Weber Point Event Center:

The park has a front row view of the waterfront, acres of grass, and a free interactive fountain. In the spring and fall, scan the water closely for the resident sea otters and birds. During the summer, watch as the yachts and fishing boats cruise by.

EAT O'Ryleigh's Tavern: Dark wood walls, dark pints of Guinness, and delicious Irish pub-grub are the backdrop for live nightly entertainment.
