The Downtown Stockton Alliance (DSA) is a major partner contributing to environmental improvements and economic development downtown. We are an advocate for great downtown projects, a partner in strategies for promoting investment, and a liaison to many community partners interested in downtown events and opportunities.

DSA oversees the safety, maintenance, and hospitality of downtown; supports public and private partnerships; encourages investment; co-sponsors special events, arts, and cultural activities downtown. These efforts are funded through the 123-square block Downtown **Property Based Business Improvement District** established in 1997 and recertified in 2002, 2007 and 2017. Our PBID promotes business, housing, arts & entertainment to help create a vibrant, sustainable, and urban community in Downtown Stockton.

MESSAGE FROM THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR



2023 was a new chapter in the history of the DSA as we began the year in our new office in the historic Belding Building on the 5th floor.

Boy what a year it has been. We took on a plethora of projects that will bring attention to our beautiful Downtown Stockton.

In partnership with San Joaquin County and funded by an American Rescue Plan Act grant we were able to help multiple properties and businesses with programs that included a broken window fund, street pole banner program, reimbursement for new Chamber memberships, a window wrap program, free parking for Stockton Con, and the reimbursement of our private property owners' 2022/2023 assessment fees in an effort to provide some relief from the economic effects of the pandemic.

Another exciting program was the Public/Private partnership with the City of Stockton through an American Rescue Plan Act grant to improve the façade of over 80 properties. This grant included structural restoration; window and door replacements; exterior finishes such as paint, siding, stucco, or veneer; awnings; lighting; signage; and outdoor dining enclosures. You have probably been able to see the difference in how Downtown looks as the revitalization efforts continue to make Downtown the thriving heart of our amazing City.

This year, we co-hosted recurring annual events, including the Mid-Autumn Festival, National Night Out, and Christmas at the Children's Museum. For something new, we also partnered with Tony Yadon and the Parent's by Choice agency, who owns the Courthouse Plaza, for the Main Street Market's Music under the Marquee; this event featured food and craft vendors and live music at the Bob Hope/Fox California Theater on the second and fourth Tuesdays of May, June, and July.

We handed off the Bathroom/ Shower unit to Loads of Hope in July. Their organization which provides services to the unsheltered was a great fit; they added the unit to their portfolio, continuing to make the St. John's Episcopal Church a place people in need can get a shower, wash their clothes, get medical exams, and connect them with agencies that can help them transition out of homelessness.

Through a grant from the City of Stockton, we boosted our social media platforms to increase the reach of our posts and the size of our network of followers. We also received tourism funding through

the County which we used to produce a commercial highlighting the remarkable things we have here in Downtown Stockton. It was shown for three months on two different networks, reaching an audience in a 50-mile radius.

We accomplished all these projects while continuing to keep Downtown clean and safe.

I want to thank the County and City for the support and partnerships, but most importantly, I want to thank my staff at the DSA for working so hard, taking on the above projects and executing them to completion. They truly do go above and beyond the daily call of duty. They inspire me daily with their commitment and dedication to their jobs. When you look around Downtown, you can see the fruits of their labor. Please when you pass by a DSA team member, let them know you notice their efforts.

I can't wait to see what we can do to top 2023 in 2024.



MARKETING DIVISION



In 2023, the Downtown Stockton Alliance marketing division achieved several milestones. We featured the following five businesses in our Doorways to Downtown series: Orlando's Deli and Market, San Joaquin County Law Library, Law Office of Jacob Benguerel, Mexican Heritage Center and Gallery, Cast Iron Trading Co. Furthermore, the Downtown Stockton Alliance continued our live monthly podcast Talk to Downtown, across multiple platforms such as YouTube, Instagram, Facebook, X, and Linkedin.

This year's Spirits of Downtown episode featured Americana Stockton, located on North San Joaquin Street, and was well-received with the highest video premiere view count in DSA history. In addition, our YouTube channel saw a massive spike in viewership across all our videos.

2023 also saw the creation and premiere of the Downtown Stockton Alliance's first televised commercial. The DSA's 30-second spot was shown on KOVR and FOX40 throughout Northern and Central California. The commercial alone reached over 80,000 views when uploaded to the Downtown Stockton YouTube page.

A popular event the marketing division helped facilitate in collaboration with the San Joaquin Office of Education, San Joaquin Probation Office, and Parents by Choice was National Night Out, which brought hundreds of people around Bob Hope Theater and Diversity Plaza for an evening of music, prizes, food, and entertainment. In addition, the Downtown Stockton Alliance participated in multiple events such as Trunk or Treat and National Parking Day.

Ticket giveaways for downtown events also contributed to increased foot traffic in the area. During the calendar year, the DSA gave tickets away to many of our social media followers for events such as Stockton Ports games, Stockton Kings games, Adventist Health Arena shows, and the Magic Lantern Festival. The team also focused on creating monthly e-newsletters for subscribers and partners. These efforts led to significant growth in social media followers and website traffic. In addition to these newsletters, ad boosting dollars curiosity of the previous year's social media marketing ARPA grant were spent to increase engagement on the DSA's YouTube, Instagram, Facebook, and X.

A significant initiative in 2023 was the Downtown Window Wrap program, funded through the American Rescue Plan Act, which beautified and advertised many downtown businesses.

ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT



2023 has been a major year of execution and reporting for the **Economic Development Department!**

Grants Galore

This year, we continued expending the \$1M+ of San Joaquin County (SJC) ARPA funding to support our Downtown Stockton business owners and property owners through several impactful programs and initiatives. Thanks to this funding, we launched and completed our SJC ARPA Downtown Stockton Entrepreneur Support Program, through which we reimbursed 68 businesses for up to \$1,000 of 2023 chamber membership or business development workshop fees! It's wonderful to have been able to help our small businesses get access to memberships and educational programs that can fuel their success. Through the SJC ARPA Downtown Stockton Window Repair Reimbursement Program, we reimbursed 18 businesses for the repair of at least 43 windows in 2023. Businesses who have used the program so far include:

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There is still funding available for window repairs, so if you are a downtown business owner who has had a broken window repaired since January of 2023, use the QR code below for the Window Repair Reimbursement Program to receive reimbursement for up to \$800 per window while funding lasts!

We helped at least 21 businesses through our SJC ARPA Downtown Stockton Window Wrap Fund; paid \$9,000 to provide free visitor parking at the 2023 Summer StocktonCon; and used other SJC ARPA dollars to place banners down Miner Avenue, in Diversity Plaza, along Ring Road, and throughout Downtown.

The largest downtown initiative funded by SJC ARPA dollars this year was the reimbursement issued to ALL downtown private property owners for their 2022/2023 assessments, an amount totaling to \$615,352.52. We are thankful to the county for this opportunity to provide one-time relief to our property owners, and for investing so much into restoring the economic vitality of our downtown. The remainder of SJC ARPA funding will be spent by 2026.

eparate from the SJC ARPA funding, we applied for and received a SJC Tourism Promotion Grant in early 2023 through which we were able to create and launch a commercial promoting Downtown's venues, landmarks, businesses, and events! This \$58,800 grant paid for the commercial's in-house production; airing on FOX40, KMAX31, and CBS13; and social media promotion, leading to over 80,000 Youtube

Beyond the many county-funded projects we took on this year, we also completed spending of the \$100,000 City of Stockton (COS) ARPA Marketing Grant, through which we were able to put money behind 100 business promos, 116 job posts, and 360 events posts, which highlighted over 400 jobs and 1,400 events. An average of 15 businesses benefitted every month. This grant led to a reach of 3,941,234 on FB & IG; 8,759,044 in LinkedIn & Twitter impressions; 669,287 impressions/8,986 clicks on Youtube channels; and an increase of nearly 5,000 followers on Facebook alone! The aim of this grant was attraction of patrons to our downtown businesses and events; connection of locals with Downtown job opportunities; and growth of the DSA's social media engagement and follower count. All of these goals were achieved! Just a few of the businesses and organizations who benefited from this grant included

Another huge grant project we took on this year in partnership with the City of Stockton was the launch and management of the Business Façade Improvement Grant Program. This program provided the opportunity for Downtown business and property owners to apply for and receive up to \$25,000 in façade improvements. As of December 2023, we have completed facade improvements for 25 properties. We will be accepting the last applications at the end of January 2024; by the time you are reading this report, the funding will have been fully allocated! If you want to view the impact of our staff's work on this project so far, I encourage you to take a trip downtown to see the improvements to the following buildings/businesses:

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In a final word on grants, we also completed the spending of 4 grants received from the City and County for our Portable Bathroom & Shower Unit program, which we handed off to Uplift All in the middle

Our 6th year of #propertymondays featured 34 unique Downtown Stockton properties in 45 #propertymondays posts on Facebook and X. creating a reach of 39,505 accounts on FB and 5,016 on X, and drawing 2,233 views of the DSA's real estate directory pages.

In terms of stakeholder outreach, we sent out our 12 monthly business owner enewsletters, and 12 monthly property owner enewsletters to keep you informed of DSA updates, news, resources, investment opportunities, and more. We also put out 2023 stakeholder surveys, which are still active/accepting responses. If you haven't already taken the survey, please take them via the QR codes below!

In relation to our Downtown Stockton Enterprise Loan Fund (DSELF), this year we signed a new contract with Valley First Credit Union, giving them the ability to underwrite our DSELF loans. At the moment, we have over \$180,000 of funding available to loan out specifically to Downtown Stockton business and property owners in amounts from \$10,000 \$65,000! We were happy to serve as advocates and ambassadors this year

in multiple ways. We participated in Business Team San Joaquin; a COS North Shore Area-Wide Plan working group; the Downtown Stockton Transformation Project Open House, and the COS EDD's meetings aimed at the development of the Stockton Entrepreneurship Ecosystem Map — a useful tool for any business looking to navigate local entrepreneurship resources. Our Executive Director and myself also attended the International Downtown Association's 2023 Conference in Chicago this past October, at which we represented our Downtown and were exposed to the inspiring projects and ideas of other business improvement districts.

State of Downtown

We have seen movement in real estate this year. Over the course of the year, at least 29 properties were sold within the district, and at year's end, there were 32 properties listed for sale and/or lease in
